Electronics Recycling Update

When the Covered Devices Recycling Act (CDRA) fully goes into effect in January of 2013, computers, monitors, peripherals, and TVs will be officially banned from Pennsylvania's landfills. As a result, all consumers, and all businesses with less than 50 employees, must be able to recycle these covered devices at no cost. By that time, third party electronics demanufacturers will have to be registered with the PA Department of Environmental Protection, and should have agreements in place with large electronics manufacturers (Samsung, Toshiba, HP, etc.) to cover the cost of recycling the material turned in by consumers and small businesses. This is a true application of "extended producer responsibility" we talked about a few issues ago. Westmoreland Cleanways and recycling offices in counties across the state are putting plans in place to deal with what is expected to be a huge volume of e-waste that will have to be recycled properly.

Westmoreland Cleanways added e-waste to its Hard-to-Recycle collections in 2007. At first, we had to charge consumers for the service, Once the CDRA was passed in 2010, e-waste demanufacturers were able to offer e-waste recycling at no cost. In 2011, we took in over 89,000 lbs. from 5 collection events.

Westmoreland Cleanways signed an agreement this year with JVS Environmental Services from Somerset, PA to collect electronic waste at our 2012 collection events. We are excited to work with JVS as we continue to expand our e-waste collections to include not only covered devices, but ALL electronic waste, from stereos and VCRs to microwaves, Christmas lights, and fax machines. "Anything with a cord" is considered an electronic device, and we'll take'em all at NO CHARGE.

News for Electronics Retailers and Repair Shops

According to the CDRA, all electronics retailers, such as Sears, Walmart, Best Buy, etc. must either provide recycling of covered electronic devices to their customers, or provide information on where such e-waste can be recycled. Best Buy has been recycling consumer electronics from its customers for a while now; it is not known if other large retailers will follow suit. HOWEVER, small retailers, repair shops, and businesses with less than 50 employees, have the same rights as consumers, and must be able to recycle their e-waste at no charge.

In response to what we believe will be a huge need, Westmoreland Cleanways is setting up an e-waste drop-off site to serve the small business community. Whether you are a small business, electronics vendor, a repair shop, or broker, you will be able to recycle your e-waste through Westmoreland Cleanways at no charge.

The drop-off collection site is located in Central Westmoreland County, will be limited to small businesses, and be open by appointment only with Westmoreland Cleanways staff. A second site will be opened if demand warrants. If you are reading this, please pass the information on to your computer consultant, IT guru, and anyone who will qualify for this service.

Program details are being finalized, and the service is scheduled to be operational in the next couple of weeks. There is no limit to volume, and all covered devices will be accepted AT NO CHARGE. If you would like to be notified directly with details, please send an email or call to be added to our electronics vendor distribution list.

This should be a great opportunity to allow local retailers to remain competitive in the marketplace, serve their customers well, and comply with requirements of the CDRA.

**Recycle More—Throw Away Less**

That sounds simple enough, and something we've been advocating for a number of years. It's the subject of almost all of the phone calls and inquiries received at our office. "Where can I recycle such-and-such"? One of our most disappointing tasks is telling people, "sorry, there's no place to recycle that." It is discouraging, and makes us feel sometimes like we're not trying hard enough, but the bottom line is, some things just aren't recyclable. OR, it may be recyclable but not around here.

Large plastic toys, swimming pools, vinyl siding, Styrofoam, automotive glass, plate glass, incandescent light bulbs. These are a few of the more popular items we have to say no to AROUND HERE. In other parts of the state, or country, facilities exist that can recycle rigid plastic, Styrofoam, and non-container glass. Some day, perhaps the right opportunity will present itself to make it feasible to collect these items. Until then, there are plenty of materials that CAN be recycled that we can concentrate on.

In the Winter 2012 newsletter, we told you about the expanded push for recycling of film plastic, not just the grocery store bags, but shrink wrap and dry-cleaning bags and the plastic around cases of paper products or diapers. Since then, the call has been put forth from the Association of Plastic Recyclers for increased recycling of "plastic closures". The "Caps On" initiative encourages communities to educate its residents to include caps on the plastic bottles they recycle.

The Closure and Container Manufacturers Association (CCMA) and the Association of Postconsumer Plastic Recyclers (APR), stress the importance of collecting valuable, recyclable plastic. There are domestic markets for recyclable plastics, especially those types of plastics found in bottles, containers, and their closures. APR member companies report growing demand for recycled plastic resins such as the polypropylene and polyethylene commonly found in caps and lids.



This change to keep closures on bottles is an about-face from industry-based recycling requirements of years before. "It will not be a quick shift, but boosting plastic recycling rates is an important ongoing commitment", says the CCMA. With approximately 1.5 billion pounds of plastic closures produced each year, there's plenty of material to be recovered, reprocessed, and recycled.

## What Does Westmoreland Cleanways Mean To You?

"Cleanways" has gone through a few changes in the 22 years of its existence. Beginning in 1990 as PA CleanWays, this office became PA CleanWays of Westmoreland County when the organization decided to spread out into other counties to carry on its mission of empowering people to clean up their environment. As the major illegal dumpsites in Westmoreland County were gradually cleaned up, emphasis shifted more to recycling as a way not only to keep stuff out of illegal dump sites, but to manage waste in the most environmentally suitable way. Our first agreement with Westmoreland County to serve as the county recycling coordinator was signed in 1995. That emphasis on recycling continues to be a driving force in our mission to protect Westmoreland County's environment. By 2005, both PA Cleanways State Office' and PA CleanWays of Westmoreland County's boards of directors felt the need to clarify their missions: PA CleanWays, Inc. to combat illegal dumping and littering on a state-wide level, and PA CleanWays of Westmoreland County to reiterate its dedication to serving all of Westmoreland County. *The solution for PA CleanWays of Westmoreland County was to change our name and logo to Westmoreland Cleanways.*

Programming continued to evolve, offering not only illegal dumping/litter abatement and recycling, but an extensive education outreach which includes programs for both youth and adult audiences, displays at events such as the Westmoreland Fair, and a comprehensive website of recycling and environmental resources available throughout the county. And then there's composting ... and technical assistance for business and municipal recycling programs. Oh, and did we mention our MEMBERS? Our VOLUNTEERS? Our SPONSORS? Our FUNDERS? We're all so intertwined, Westmoreland Cleanways could not function without any one of these groups.

Through all of this, the organization has been guided by a dedicated board of directors and staff concerned about providing the most comprehensive and knowledgeable service to our constituents in Westmoreland County. In the Fall of 2011, board and staff participated in a retreat to recommit to the principles of Westmoreland Cleanways, to figure out where we've been, whether we're on the right path, and what can be done to strengthen the organization.

A result of the board/staff retreat was the acknowledgement that we are truly many things to many people. People who know us for one program may not even know or care what else we do. We also have always recognized that to some people, we will always be "PA CleanWays", even though our name changed over six years ago. Trouble is, until 2011, there was another PA CleanWays in Greensburg (which is now Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful). Good organization, but they're not us, and we're not them, and we do different things. Our own supporters don't always know the difference. Conclusion? We have an identify crisis: Who do people think we are? Who do we think we are? What do people want from us? What do they expect from us? How do we overcome the identity crisis? Do we try? And, Does anybody really care except us?

So ....we'll ask you, our constituents, the people we serve, the reason we exist, the reason we do what we do. Who do you think we are? The accompanying survey is intended to let us know what you want from us, whether we're meeting your needs, and what you'd like to see from us in the future. iROGO—Do You?

You may notice on the Spring Quarterly Calendar on P. 7 something that says iROGO. If your curiosity gets the better of you, here's the scoop. iROGO is a program sponsored by Keep America Beautiful which stands for "I Recycle On The Go". Westmoreland Cleanways is promoting the program to anyone who borrows our ClearStream recycling bins and is adept at Twitter.

Westmoreland Cleanways first began offering ClearStream recycling bins in 2006 thanks to a grant from the Katherine Mabis McKenna Foundation. Over the years, the program proved so popular that there were times we actually did not have enough bins to meet demand. In the fall of 2011, we applied for a grant sponsored by Keep America Beautiful for additional ClearStream recycling bins, and were fortunate enough to receive 30 additional containers, valued at \$1,500. Along with the bins came the offer to promote "iROGO".

Have you ever found yourself holding an empty pop can or water bottle but there's no recycling bin around ... and you just can't bring yourself to throw it in the trash? So have we! The goal of iROGO, therefore, is to remind and encourage people to recycle while they are out and about, AND to provide the means to do so.

Westmoreland Cleanways and Keep America Beautiful's iROGO Team have launched the first-ever "Quest to Recycle on the Go", and will be awarding prizes to both event organizers and individuals who use the Twitter hashtag, #iROGO, to chat about where they recycle. The first phase of Quest to Recycle on the Go ran in October and November; the second phase runs through April 23; Phase 3 will run May 17 through June 4, and the final Phase 4 will run June 28 through July 9. If you borrow our ClearStream bins during any of the Quest phases, and promote chatter about your event on Twitter, you will be eligible to win a \$50 VISA gift card based on volume of chatter generated; in addition, five randomly selected individuals will win a \$15 iTunes gift card during each phase.

Complete details for organizers of the Quest to Recycle on the Go will be provided to anyone borrowing our ClearStreams recycling containers between now and mid-July. If you're adept at social media, particularly Twitter, here's a great opportunity to promote your event AND recycling, and have an opportunity to win a prize. Graduation parties, marathons, festivals, Earth Day events...there are lots of opportunities coming up to promote Recycling on the Go. Give it a try!

### **Backyard Composting Workshops**

There's always something new to learn about composting your kitchen scraps and yard waste. Most people think about composting in the fall when trees start to shed their leaves, but experience has shown that there's just as much, if not more, yard waste to be cleaned up in the spring. In addition, material collected in the spring often has a lot of moisture in it, and will begin to "cook" as soon as it's put into a pile. By the end of summer, it will be just about ready to spread on beds, borders, and lawns so nutrients can work their way into the soil over the winter.

Three Backyard Composting Workshops are scheduled for Spring (see Quarterly Calendar on P. 7 for dates). Cost of the workshop is \$10 per person, payable at the door. Pre-registration is encouraged.

Law enforcement officials and volunteers will staff each collection site from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Participants should be prepared to empty their medicine containers directly into the collection box and take the empty containers, and anything listing personal identification information, back home with them.
